

Evangelist (Mrs.) Ofonmbuk Enobong-Obot is a public servant, pastor, philanthropist, councilor, wife, and mother to many. Born in Afaha Etok, Ibesikpo Asutan LGA, she graduated from the University Of Uyo (nee Cross River State) in 1990 with BSc Hons in Home Economics.



In January 1997, she gained employment into Mobil Producing Nigeria Ultd., Qua Iboe Terminal, a Subsidiary of ExxonMobil Corporation as Coordinator, Catering Onshore/Offshore, and with hard work and an extraordinary work ethic, she soon became responsible for managing large scale catering contracts and contractors, guest houses & dormitories, cafeterias /restaurants, in/outdoor catering, housekeeping services, janitorial services, and office support. Through the years, she has worked in various locations including offshore in Eket & Bonny

River Terminals, in River State. She is currently the Facilities Supervisor, in the Support Operations Dept.

She was called by God into the ministry some years ago to preach the gospel and spread the good news of the kingdom. She sees herself as someone who helps people solve their problems physically, spiritually and emotionally.

In 2006, she began the God-given vision/ministry “Ofonmbuk Obot Foundation”, a non-governmental, non-profit organization to care for society’s less privileged, especially widows and orphans. To date, she has supported countless widows financially, emotionally and spiritually to have hope after the death of their spouse.

In 2007, at the annual get together tagged “Giving Back to Widows, Orphans & Less Privileged”, her foundation distributed 300 wrappers (ofong isin) rice, baby food, diapers, salt, detergent, toiletries, milk, beverages, etc... in Eket, Ibeno, ONNA & Esit Eket LGAs.

At the 2008 annual program “Your Family & You”, gifts bags, wrappers, rice, salt, school bags, women bags, school supplies, etc... were given out to registered widows and other women in Ibesikpo Asutan LGA, Eket & Calabar, benefiting approximately 400 families.

In 2009, the Foundation empowered 20 widows in Eket to begin rice & other petty trading. During their annual program named “There is Love in Giving”, they gave out gifts bags, rice, salt, wrappers, school bags, school supplies, etc to 250 widows, orphans and less privileged in Mberiebe Obio in Ibesikpo, Eket and Esit Eket LGAs. Additionally, the foundation has supplied medical support including eye tests to more than 250 people and eye glasses to over 100 persons.

To date a total of eleven children have benefited from their scholarship scheme, and the foundation visits orphanage homes in ONNA and Esit Eket annually to donate various items like rice, toiletries, diapers, baby milk/food, noodles, children’s clothing etc... They continue to provide medical support to Ediene village in Ikono LGA and organize a malaria eradication program in Ogoja, Ikom & Obudu in Northern Cross River State.

Her future plans are to empower more widows and sponsor orphans and the less privileged to go to school and learn a trade. She will soon start an annual program ‘The Plight of Widows’. Mrs. Ofonmbuk Enobong-Obot is married to Engr. Enobong Obot and they are blessed with 5 children (2

girls and 3 boys). Her hobbies include reading Christian novels, preaching the Word, extending a helping hand, cooking and teaching.
