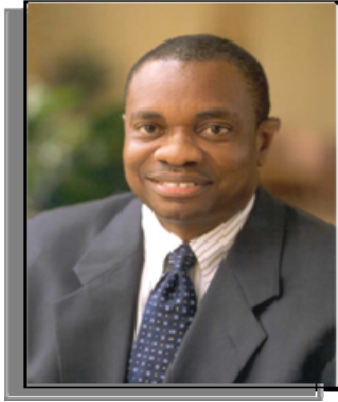


Udom Uko Inoyo holds a bachelor's degree in Political Science (1981) and Law (1987) both from the University of Calabar. He was called to the Nigerian Bar as Solicitor & Advocate of the Supreme Court in 1988. Between December 1982 and June 1989, Udom worked as an Administrative Officer with the Cross River and Akwa Ibom States Government in Calabar and the Liaison offices in Lagos. He is an advocate for public service.



He started his career with Mobil Producing Company in July 1989 in Lagos, Nigeria, as an Employee Relations Coordinator, but by 2000, he became Compensation and Benefits Advisor, ExxonMobil Europe, Africa & Middle East Center of Expertise, in Brussels, Belgium, where he had responsibility for the National Salary Programs of 10 African and 4 European countries. In 2001, Udom returned to Nigeria as Manager, Human Resources Policies & Programs for Mobil Producing Nigeria. By 2004, he was appointed to the Board of Mobil Producing Nigeria, the second largest oil producing company in Nigeria, as Executive Director. As of 2006, Udom is the In-Country Human Resources Manager for ExxonMobil subsidiary companies in Nigeria. In this role, he has direct responsibility for over 2,000 employees of the 3 ExxonMobil companies and approximately 3,000 personnel of various third party contractors. Udom Inoyo has been actively engaged in activities of the oil and gas sector in Nigeria. Between 2004 and now, Udom has chaired both the External Affairs and Human Resources committees of the Oil Producers Trade Sector (OPTS); a body representing the interests of all upstream oil and gas producing companies in Nigeria.

Of additional importance is the fact that Udom has a passion for human and community development. In response to the need for private sector involvement in eradicating poverty through education, he launched the Inoyo Toro Foundation in 2007.

With the vision to improve the standard of education in Akwa Ibom State, the Foundation encourages the development of physics, chemistry, biology, mathematics and English Language in the state's public secondary schools and creates awareness for the importance of these subjects for the study of science and applied sciences. It is one of the first in Nigeria involved in the recognition of public school teachers (Annual Award for Excellence) as a way to support educational development and improve the standard of education in Akwa Ibom state in particular and Nigeria at large. As well, using public secondary schools as the focal point, it complements the efforts of the state government. The Foundation is also involved in the mentoring of Secondary school students, and the collection of education data to assist in policy formation.

Udom currently resides in Lagos with his wife and children. He enjoys reading and playing golf.
